Post-accident claim tips

Don't be 'steered' in the wrong direction

When a car accident puts you in a tailspin it's important to know your rights, especially when it comes to filing an insurance claim.

Not only is your vehicle one of the biggest investments you'll ever make, but it also carries your most valuable possessions – your loved ones. That's why it's so important to choose a collision repair center that truly has your best interests in mind. Unfortunately, some insurance companies will have you believe they know best and if you don't follow their advice, they may not pay.

There is a term for that kind of behavior, and it's called steering.

Steering occurs when an insurance company, representative, or claims system attempts to convince a consumer to use a particular repair facility or vendor. In Minnesota, steering is illegal.

“By state law, you can take your vehicle to the shop of your choice,” said Mike Zieska of MCP Collision and Glass in Annandale.

That's the message Mike and other Minnesota collision centers want to get across.

“We want to inform customers of their rights and that it's their choice,” he said.

He added that not every insurance company plays this game. He works with many

local insurance agents who do have their customers' best interests at heart. A trusted, local insurance agency can be a great resource when it comes to choosing a collision repair center which will make for a smoother collision repair experience,” he said.

But ultimately, it's the collision centers, not insurance companies, that are liable for your vehicle repairs, so it is in the collision center's best interest to repair your vehicle

to pre-accident condition. The problem is some insurance companies are refusing to pay for certain repairs that collision centers like MCP know are necessary to your safety and the value of your vehicle.

insurance coverage. MCP Collision and Glass will help you to understand what is being repaired and why.

By law insurers must inform those filing a claim of their legal right to choose a repair shop with the understanding that their policy will cover the reasonable costs of repairing their vehicle to its pre-accident condition no matter where repairs are made. But after they have selected a repair shop, the insurer must cease all efforts to influence their choice. If they don't, they are guilty of steering.

The following are some indications that you are being steered:

You told your insurance company which shop you selected, and they stated they likely would not pay for all repairs at that shop but would pay for all repairs at a shop the insurance company selected.

Your insurance company leads you to believe you could only use one of their recommended shops or parts suppliers.

On the mobile app from some insurance companies, you could only move forward with processing the claim by using a shop from their drop-down list.

Choose a trusted collision center

When choosing a collision center, beware of shops that are more focused on making an insurance company's referral list than customer satisfaction and safety. Technology should also be considered. For instance, a windshield replacement can require recalibration for the adaptive cruise control and pedestrian detection to work as the manufacturer intended.

Additionally, lane centering, lane lock, blind spot detection and automatic braking or collision avoidance can be affected by the repair process. If you have these systems and you don't see calibration on your estimate, ask why.

It comes down to finding a shop that has the equipment and training to repair your vehicle to pre-accident condition and maintain your vehicle's safety and value. "At MCP Collision and Glass we are committed to this," Mike said.

Whiskey 101 -Explained in the most simple form

THE PROCESS OF MAKING WHISKEY

The type of whiskey produced is dependent on a variety of factors such as geographical location, grains used, distillation methods and types of casks to name a few.

Single Malt -vs- Blend Whiskey

A SINGLE MALT WHISKEY is created from one distillery, made from a mash that only uses one particular malted grain. For example, a single malt scotch whisky is made from malted barley.

A BLENDED WHISKEY is made from blending different types of whiskeys from many different distilleries.

A BLENDED MALT is a blend of single malt whiskeys

KINDS OF WHISKEY - The word which comes before the Whiskey tells you where the whiskey comes from - and each country that makes whiskey has its own rules and laws they must abide by.

Scotch Whisky

Made in Scotland, Scotch Whisky must be distilled twice and matured for a minimum of 3 years in oak casks. Scotch whisky without an age statement may, by law, be as young as three years old. Any age statement on the bottle, in the form of a number, must reflect the age of the youngest Scotch whisky used to produce that product.

Scotch malt whiskeys are divided into 7 regions; Highland, Lowland, Islay, Speyside, Islands, Grain and Campbeltown. Every region has certain distilleries that create scotch with flavors and aromas distinct to that region.

American Whiskey

American Whiskey is whiskey made in America. However, some of these whiskeys can be made outside of the US, with the exception of Tennessee Whiskey.

BOURBON WHISKEY—made from mash that consists of at least 51% corn (maize)

CORN WHISKEY(Moonshine)—made from mash that consists of at least 80% corn

MALT WHISKEY—made from mash that consists of at least 51% malted barley

RYE WHISKEY—made from mash that consists of at least 51% rye

RYE MALT WHISKEY—made from mash that consists of at least 51% malted rye

WHEAT WHISKEY—made from mash that consists of at least 51% wheat

All Whiskies listed above must follow the following rules. They must be distilled to no more than 80% alcohol by volume, & barrelled at no more than 125 proof. 'Proof' in the US is two times percentage of alcohol by volume. So, in order to be American Whiskey, it must be barreled at no less than 62.5% alcohol by volume.

Only water may be added to the final product -the addition of colouring or flavouring is prohibited. Whiskies must be aged in NEW charred-oak containers, except for corn whiskey which does not have to be aged. Corn whiskey is usually un-aged and sold as a legal version of moonshine. This is also why moonshine isn't a dark color like other whiskeys - because the barrel aging process is where most of the color comes from.

Back in the 1800's, distillers used to mess with their whiskeys, sometimes trying

to enhance the flavor, other times trying to dilute them. This eventually led to the Bottle in Bond Act of 1897, which helped come up with this stipulation.

TENNESSEE WHISKEY - An American whiskey produced using a method called, the Lincoln County Process. Before the whiskey is moved to barrels or casks, it is filtered or steeped in charcoal. This was signed into law by the governor of Tennessee on May 13, 2013. The most popular of these is Jack Daniel's.

Canadian Whisky

Canadian Whisky is made in Canada. The rules are a bit different, whiskeys may contain caramel and flavouring in addition to the distilled mash spirits. No maximum limit on the alcohol level of the distillation. To be exported under one of the "Canadian Whiskey" designations, a whiskey can't have more than 9.09% imported spirits.

Irish Whiskey

Irish Whiskey is whiskey that must be produced in Ireland - Irish whiskeys are normally distilled three times (with one exception). By law, Irish whiskey must

The only difference is that when making beer, hops are added when producing wort. This helps add flavor to the beer and balances the sweetness. Whiskey doesn't need hops because it ages in oak barrels for flavor.

After wort is fermented, it becomes 'wash'. This is fermented liquid that is ready to get distilled. From here it is placed in a still, such as a pot still or column still. This heats up the liquid and the vapors travel through a pipe at the top and come out the other side. During this distilling process, the alcoholic content is increased. This happens two or three times and in some cases up to 20 times, each time becoming more alcoholic. The whiskey is then transferred to casks or barrels and aged. As they age, they are blended with other whiskeys to create a particular brand's signature flavor.

be produced in Ireland, aged in wooden casks for a period of no less than three years and unpeated malt is almost always used.

Japanese Whiskey

Japanese Whiskey has been growing in popularity. They produce whiskey that is most similar to single malt scotch from Scotland. It is also made from malted barley. Popular brands include Nikka and Suntory. Japanese whisky is also closer in taste to traditional Scotch whisky because many of the Japanese companies are buying distilleries in Scotland in order to make their whiskeys.

Whiskey vs Whisky

This is highly debated, but comes down to the origins of the word and who you are talking to. The New York Times dove into this issue and came out with the understanding that if you are talking about whiskey in general, it is fine to say whiskey. However, Canadian and Scottish folk say Whisky. So - when referring to scotch (because it's from Scotland), you would say scotch whisky - no E.
