Wine is probably the most popular selection when it comes to pairing with holiday meals. If you are looking to impress your guests with a fun, local wine, General Manager Ang Berthiaume recommends trying something from Carlos Creek's Minnesota Nice series. Their Hot Dish Red is the Alexandria winery's No. 1 selling label and is promoted as pairing well with holiday leftovers but goes well with everything, Berthiaume said. Their You Betcha' Blush is another popular pick with its fruity taste and rosé coloring. Then there is Wobegon White, which complements a variety of foods and is

If you favor beer over wine but still want something unique Dangerous Man Brewing might be the ticket. Brewed right here in Maple Lake at the Dangerous Man production facility, their seasonal brews are as popular as their standard House IPA. Try their Peanut Butter Porter for a dark, nutty taste or their Hazy IPA for a juicier, smooth almost tropical flavor. MLWS also carries their POG Sour and Kolsch.

If you are looking for something that shouts tradition, Fireball has an eggnog on the shelves

called Yule Nog. New this season from Stella Rosa is a trio of cream liqueurs that may just provide the perfect ending to your holiday meal. Try one or all. They come in salted caramel, pistachio and chocolate hazelnut.

I you are looking for something completely different THC cocktails are becoming increasingly popular. MLWS also carries a large selection of non-alcoholic wines and beers.

The Maple Lake liquor store is also a great

Maple Lake Wine and Spirits isn't just another run-of-the-mill liquor store. It's a hometown "muni" owned and operated by The City of Maple Lake which means all the money you spend here goes back into local projects and works to keep city taxes low, but best of all, staff are legitimately happy to see you and serve you.

"You're not just a number to us. We know you by name," Berthiaume said.

The staff's devotion to friendly and honest service has earned them the loyalty and support of their customers, and it shows. This year alone, they raised more than \$4,500 through fundraisers and events they hosted to benefit the community, and every dollar went back into different, local organizations. For instance, every year MLWS holds an in-store silent auction fundraiser for the Maple Lake Fire Department to purchase needed equipment and every year the liquor store's patrons rise to the occasion. This year, they raised \$2,972 for that endeavor.

MLWS also collects donations for the local food shelf and the Maple Lake Public Schools' Backpack Buddies program. Backpack Buddies provide families in need with a holiday basket filled with generously donated essentials like toilet paper, soaps, deodorants, etc. plus all the fixings for a holiday meal and food to keep kids satisfied through the Christmas break.

Every fall, the liquor store participates in the local library fundraiser. This event is the biggest fundraiser of the year for the all-volunteer run Maple Lake Library and Wine and Spirits contributes by offering

a 10 percent discount on any wines customers buy to donate to the event's wine pull, plus, staff sees that the wine gets to the fundraiser on time. Customers can also donate cash and liquor store staff will pick out the wine.

A great selection

Plus, it's that time of the year for all the seasonal flavors to make their appearance, such as RumChata Peppermint bark cream and Mothers pumpkin pie liqueur. Maple Lake Wine and Spirits has a "great selection for a small, hometown liquor store and customers like that we have such a wide variety," Berthiaume said. "If you can't find something you are looking for, just ask and we'll order it."

Rewards program

To make shopping at Maple Lake Wine and Spirits economical, Berthiaume and her staff have a successful rewards program called the Lucky Irish Rewards where every pre-taxed dollar spent earns customers a point. When they reach 500 points, they get a \$10 in-store credit. Monthly specials on domestic beers, craft beers and wines make shopping at Maple Lake Wine and Spirits even more affordable.

Wine Club

It's important for the staff at Maple Lake Wine and Spirits to promote the community, which is why they organize a successful Wine Club that currently has 300 members and meets every six to eight weeks. They hold numerous wine tastings throughout the year that are open to the public but offer discounts to members. In September they hosted a Beers Brats and Bourbon night and in November they held a Minnesota Hotdish Night that paired four different types of hot dishes with wines from Winehaven Winery in Chisago Lakes.

On Dec. 10, MLWS will hold its annual Holiday Wine and Spirits Tasting. From 7 to 9 p.m. at the American Legion in Maple Lake sample a wide variety of items and find the perfect fit for your holiday get togethers. As always wine club members receive a discount on the ticket price.

Walleye limit at three for winter on Mille Lacs

MN DNR Report

The walleye limit for ice fishing season on Mille Lacs Lake will remain at three fish longer than 17 inches, only one of which can be longer than 20 inches.

"Mille Lacs' walleye population is trending in a good direction for both adult and juvenile fish," said Brad Parsons, fisheries section manager for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "We're pleased to keep the current regulation in place for this winter and offer anglers this harvest opportunity."

For yellow perch, the daily and possession limit will be 10. The change is a shift from last year, which began with a perch daily and possession limit of 20 that had to be reduced to 5 after the state in early March, exceeded its harvest allocation. The daily and possession limit of 10 is intended to provide state anglers the opportunity to harvest a meal of perch while also keeping the state within its harvest allocation.

Each year the state and the Ojibwe nations who retain harvest rights in the 1837 Treaty Area jointly set the harvest amounts for different fish species in Mille Lacs for the year. Fall netting data informs where harvest levels will be set when the state and Tribes meet in January. Once harvest levels for the year and the state's winter harvest are known, the state may need to adjust regulations for the open water season that begins on May 9, 2026.

With northern pike increasing in abundance over the past two years to the highest numbers ever measured by the DNR, the possession limit will increase from three to five fish. This regulation retains a length limit of 30 inches that has been in place since 2020, which protects Mille Lacs Lake's trophy-sized pike, while the possession limit increase is intended to encourage additional harvest.

Winter fishing regulations for walleye will be in effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Sunday, Feb. 22, 2026. Yellow perch regulations will be in effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Friday, May 8, 2026. Northern pike regulations will be in effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Tuesday, March 31, 2026.

Winter regulations for Mille Lacs Lake are set after completion of the DNR's annual fall netting assessments. The 2025 assessment found a slightly lower adult walleye abundance than in 2024, along with strong numbers of year-old walleye that have good potential to contribute to the fishery in the future.

Forage species such as young yellow perch and tullibee also are currently abundant, allowing medium to larger walleyes to fatten up over the summer and be in good condition heading into the winter.
